Pursuant to Schedule 3 clause 21 of the Customs and Excise Act 2018, Her Excellency the Governor-General, acting on the advice and with the consent of the Executive Council, makes the following order.

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Order

1 Title

This order is the Excise and Excise-equivalent Duties Table (Tobacco Products Indexation) Amendment Order 2021.

2 Commencement

This order comes into force on 1 January 2022.

3 Excise and Excise-equivalent Duties Table

This order amends the Excise and Excise-equivalent Duties Table (the **table**) as defined in Schedule 3 clause 16 of the Customs and Excise Act 2018.

4 Rates of excise duty and excise-equivalent duty on tobacco products amended

In the table, under headings 99.60 and 99.65 in Part A and 24.02 and 24.03 in Part B replace “\$1,045.78” with “\$1,098.37”, “\$1,307.19” with “\$1,372.92”, and “\$1,490.24” with “\$1,565.18” in each place.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the order, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This order, which comes into force on 1 January 2022, adjusts the excise and excise-equivalent duties on tobacco products to reflect the movement in the Consumers Price Index All Groups (less credit services) over the 12-month period ending on 30 September 2021.

This Order must be confirmed by an Act before the close of 31 December 2022. If it is not confirmed, it will be revoked on the close of that date. See subpart 3 of Part 5 of the Legislation Act 2019.
